

# 2017-2018 Year in Review Rotary: Making a Difference

The Rotary Club of Evergreen completed yet another great year with strong growth, projects locally and internationally, and selfless giving.

# **Community Service Committee**

This committee, led by **Marianne Temple**, was responsible for giving grants and in-kind donations of \$34,590. 2,740 volunteer hours were donated by RCE members. The following are RCE Rotary Projects and grant recipients for the year.
